American Baptist, let us be reminded of our history of trials and triumphs won through Christ. May we lift our voices and shout aloud the message of the Kingdom.


May the Head of The Great Christian Church guide and guard us all as we endeavor to Live for Christ; Serving the Present Age.

Annual Session Scriptures

Acts 13:32-42

And we declare to you glad tidings—that promise which was made to the fathers. ³³ God has fulfilled this for us their children, in that He has raised up Jesus. As it is also written in the second Psalm: 'You are My Son, Today I have begotten You.' ³⁴ And that He raised Him from the dead, no more to return to ^[1] corruption, He has spoken thus: 'I will give you the sure ^[1] mercies of David.' ³⁵ Therefore He also says in another *Psalm*: 'You will not allow Your Holy One to see corruption.' ³⁶ "For David, after he had served ^[2] his own generation by the will of God, fell asleep, was buried with his fathers, and ^[1] saw corruption; ³⁷ but He whom God raised up ^[2] saw no corruption. ³⁸ Therefore let it be known to you, brethren, that through this Man is preached to you the forgiveness of sins; ³⁹ and by Him everyone who believes is justified from all things from which you could not be justified by the law of Moses. ⁴⁰ Beware therefore, lest what has been spoken in the prophets come upon you: ⁴¹ 'Behold, you despisers, Marvel and perish! For I work a work in your days, A work which you will by no means believe, Though one were to declare it to you.'"

Blessing and Conflict at Antioch

⁴² [n]So when the Jews went out of the synagogue, the Gentiles begged that these words might be preached to them the next Sabbath. ⁴³ Now when the congregation had broken up, many of the Jews and devout proselytes followed Paul and Barnabas, who, speaking to them, persuaded them to continue in the grace of God.





Rev. Dr. Reginald Van Stephens

Rev. Dr. Reginald Van Stephens serves as the 15th pastor of the historic White Rock Baptist Church, in Durham, North Carolina, and holds the distinction of being its second longest-serving pastor. His journey of faith and leadership began in January 1995 when he first preached at White Rock, culminating in his official installation in April of that same year. A native of Jacksonville, Florida, Dr. Stephens' deep-rooted commitment to the Gospel ministry ignited in October 1982 at Pinn Memorial Baptist Church in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Prior to his significant tenure at White Rock, he shepherded the congregation at Consolidated Baptist Church in Lexington, Kentucky.

Rev. Stephens is not only a dedicated pastor but also an accomplished scholar. He earned his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Edward Waters University, graduating Magna Cum Laude; a Master of Divinity from Eastern Baptist Theological Seminary (now Palmer Seminary); and a Doctor of Ministry degree from United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio. His academic excellence is further underscored by being a Samuel Proctor-Charles Booth Fellow.

Throughout his ministry at White Rock, Dr. Stephens has demonstrated remarkable leadership and vision. His initiatives include:

- Pioneering Events: He held the first women's conference, the first Prayer Retreat, and the first Young Adult Conference in the church's history, fostering inclusivity and engagement within the congregation.
- Community Outreach: Partnering with the Food Bank of Central and Eastern North Carolina, Dr. Stephens has spearheaded efforts to provide free food to as many as 1,000 individuals monthly through the Global Missions Ministry, reflecting his commitment to community service.
- Renovation and Growth: Under Pastor Stephens' leadership, the church underwent a \$1.2 million renovation of the sanctuary, which notably included the installation of a historic 32-rank Moeller/Letourneau pipe organ, enhancing the worship experience.
- Establishment of Ministries: Dr. Stephens has been instrumental in creating a diverse array of Ministries, including the first Youth Liturgical Dance Group, a dynamic Prayer Ministry, a Grief Ministry, and a Mommie and Me Ministry. His establishment of the Agape Ministry aims to support Durham's incarcerated population, demonstrating a profound concern for marginalized communities.
- Educational and Technological Advancement: Pastor Stephens established the church's first computer lab and initiated classes, alongside creating a church website, which signifies a forward-thinking approach to ministry. He recently led a group to install state-of-the art audiovisual, sound, and camera equipment that provides opportunities for worshipers who are visually challenged to have access to closed caption or American Science Language services.
- Youth and Family Development: Stephens has adopted W.G. Pearson Elementary School, provided essential school supplies and tutoring services, alongside fostering youth engagement through monthly mission activities at the Ronald McDonald House.
- Academic Contributions: Serving as a Professor of Homiletics at Shaw University Divinity School, in Raleigh, North Carolina, for 17 years, Pastor Stephens has shaped the next generation of preachers, contributing significantly to theological education.
- Broader Impact: His preaching has resonated at various national conventions, including the Progressive National Baptist Convention and the American Baptist Convention. Notably, Dr. Stephens was invited to submit one of his sermons for inclusion in the Progressive National Baptist Convention's publication, The Best of PNBC: Intergenerational Messages of Hope, showcasing his influence beyond the local church. He has also served on multiple committees and boards, including Habitat for Humanity and the Triangle Community Foundation, further emphasizing his dedication to service and leadership.

Rev. Stephens' commitment to holistic ministry is evident through the establishment of 57 ministries divided into seven clusters, each aimed at addressing the diverse needs of the congregation and the wider community. His strategic leadership has not only expanded White Rock's outreach but has also strengthened its legacy within the Baptist community.

In conclusion, Rev. Dr. Reginald Van Stephens represents a dynamic blend of pastoral care, community engagement, and educational leadership. His unwavering dedication to the mission of the church and its members, coupled with his innovative spirit, has left an indelible mark on White Rock Baptist Church and the Greater Durham area. He is a leader who exemplifies faith in action, inspiring us all to serve with purpose and compassion.





Dr. Renée L. Bradford

Dr. Renée L. Bradford, affectionately known as the Pastor of Peace, serves as President of the ABCOTS Area III Ministers Council and Minister of Administration at Mount Carmel Baptist Church in Charlotte, North Carolina. Rev. Dr. Benjamin Boswell (Collective Liberation, Charlotte, NC) is a former U.S. Army Officer with degrees from Campbell University (B.A.), Duke Divinity School (M.Div.) and Saint Paul School of Theology (D. Min.) He is a preacher, pastor, civil rights leader and public speaker who facilitates anti-racist spiritual formation courses for people racialized as White and for White dominant organizations.

Dr. Boswell has served as the pastor of three progressive congregations throughout his twenty-year ministry career and is the former Senior Minister of Myers Park Baptist Church in Charlotte, NC. Dr. Boswell is the creator and founder of Confronting Whiteness, a community of people striving to become anti-racist in their spheres of power and influence. He is active interfaith community leader, and the author of two books: For the Facing of this Hour: Preaching that resists White Christian Nationalism (2022) and Confronting Whiteness: A Spiritual Journey of Reflection, Conversation and Transformation (2022).

In 2021, at the age of forty, Dr. Boswell was awarded the city of Charlotte's prestigious Martin Luther King Jr. Medallion, which is the highest honor given to a person who promotes racial equality, social justice and community service. Most notably, he is the proud father of his 15-year-old daughter, Lucy Joy Boswell.

Rev. Charles E. Walton


Pastor ~ Preacher ~ Servant

Reverend Charles E. Walton preached his initial sermon in November 1988 at New Bethel Baptist Church in Warrenton, North Carolina. In 1990, he was elected to serve as the church's Assistant Pastor. During his time at New Bethel, Rev. Walton was also called to preach at Macon Second Baptist Church, where he faithfully delivered the message every fourth Sunday. In December 2000, while continuing to provide pastoral leadership at Macon Second, Rev. Walton was invited to become the pastor of Olive Grove Missionary Baptist Church in Littleton, NC. He recently celebrated an extraordinary milestone—38 years of pastoral ministry, reflecting his steadfast dedication to preaching, teaching, and spiritual guidance.

Rev. Walton's ministry has been marked by impactful leadership and faithful service:

Reverend Walton honorably served in the United States Air Force for four years, including two years stationed in Upper Heyford, England. Following his military service, he dedicated nearly four decades to social work in Warren and Wake counties, ultimately retiring as a supervisor with the Warren County Department of Social Services. Throughout his life, Rev. Walton has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to faith, service, and leadership. He is a proud alumnus of Shaw University and the Shaw University Divinity School. Deeply involved in his community and denominational work, he is:

- A devoted member of the Missionary Baptist Association
- Co-founder of Loaves and Fishes Ministry, Warren County

successfully united the two congregations into one loving church family.

- · A member of the Olive Grove School Board
- · A member of the General Board of the General Baptist Convention of North Carolina
- Chairman of the Finance and Elections Committee of the General Baptist State Convention
- A newly appointed Board Member of the Vance County Men's Shelter

Rev. Walton is also a proud brother of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., having been initiated through the lota Chapter at Shaw University. He is currently serving his second term as President of the Gamma Kappa Sigma Alumni Chapter, which serves the North Central region of North Carolina. Under his leadership, the chapter was honored as the 2023–2024 North Carolina Alumni Chapter of the Year, and Rev. Walton himself was recognized as a Sigma Icon by the NC State Board. His exemplary service has also led to his nomination for Alumni Brother of the Year for the fraternity's Southeastern Region.

One of Pastor Walton's most meaningful challenges and accomplishments came during the COVID-19 pandemic, when he faithfully pastored both Olive Grove Missionary Baptist Church and Macon Second Baptist Church. Through innovative weekly online worship services and spiritual leadership, he



The History of ABCOTS

The late Reverend J. C. Herrin, Program Associate with the American Baptist Home Mission Society was named as the Associate General Secretary for Work in the South from 1959-1971. Sometime during that period he wrote, "our distinctive role in the South (as American Baptist) may well be to encourage and expand an integrated Christian fellowship." Rev. Herrin pioneered ABC relationships with the Baptist churches, black and white, in the South that wished to develop a more inclusive witness across the divisive barrier of race.

The churches involved also wished to expand their role in the support of higher education as it is carried out through American Baptist related black colleges in the South. Further, these churches were committed to working with the National Council of Churches, the Southern Inter-agency Council, and the Fellowship of Southern Churches. Other persons who pioneered in the development of American Baptist relationships in the South, as "Executive Ministers for Work in the South" were Dr. Paul Stagg, in Valley Forge, 1969-1971 and Rev. Henry Marion Steele, in Atlanta, 1969-1971.

An anonymous grant of \$10,000 made in the late 1950's made it possible to study the feasibility of forming an organization of American Baptist Churches in the South. A special committee consisting of twenty-five pastors and laypersons from churches in the South was formed. This committee put together a program and an agenda for an organizational meeting of the American Baptist Churches of the South.

The organizational meeting was held from April 10 through 12, 1970 in the Myers Park Baptist Church, Charlotte, North Carolina, hosted by Mt. Carmel Baptist Church, the late Dr. Leon C. Riddick and the late Dr. E. Eugene Owens, Myers Park. The late Reverend Dr. Kelly Miller Smith was the keynote preacher. The proposal coming out of the organizational meeting was ratified by both the first formal meeting of the American Baptist churches of the South (ABCOTS) and the General Board of the American Baptist Churches, USA meeting in November and December, respectively.

The late Dr. E. B. Hicks, who had a long and distinguished career with National Ministries, ABC, was called as the first Executive Minister of the new Region, its first Annual Session, was held March 19-20, 1971, in Richmond Virginia. The session was held in the Fifth Street Baptist Church of that city. Dr. Hicks' work began on July 1, 1971, with the offices being located in Atlanta, GA.

111 churches made up the first official listing of ABCOTS. The late Dr. J. B. Henderson, pastor of the Bank Street Memorial Baptist Church, Norfolk, Virginia, became the Region's first president. From that beginning, a constant attempt has been made to maintain an office staff and elect officers that are racially inclusive and are composed of men and women across a broad age range.

The budget of the American Baptist Churches of the South has grown from \$55,000 to almost half a million dollars. The number of cooperating churches has grown from 111to 257. Churches in ABCOTS are giving close to half of the dollars being given to the Union Mission Program by ABC congregations.

The late Dr. E. B. Hicks served as the Region's Executive Minister through 1976, at which time he retired. Dr. James E. Peters, who came to the office from work with the Fund of Renewal, succeeded Dr. Hicks. Dr. Peters resigned to return to pastoral ministry.

In January 1979, Dr. Walter L. Parrish, II left the pastorate of the St. John Baptist Church of Columbia, Maryland to become the third Executive Minister of the American Baptist Churches of the South.

August 1, 2015, the fourth Executive Minister assumed duties as the Executive Director of The American Baptist of The South, Dr. James M. Harrison. Dr. Harrison is pastor of Main Street Baptist Church, Smithfield, VA.


